AFFIX USING A GLUE STICK, TAPE OR AS I DID, SIMPLY FOLD AND LAMINATE TO CREATE A STURDIER CARD. USING THIS METHOD IS AN EASY WAY FOR THE CHILD TO SELECT A WORD FOR STUDY AS WELL AS REVIEW THE WORDS AFTER THE BOOK HAS BEEN COMPLETED OR WHEN THE SCHOOL YEAR IS WINDING DOWN. MY GOAL HAS ALWAYS BEEN TO MAKE THESE CARDS MATCH THEIR CORRESPONDING BOOK, AS RESULT, THERE IS AN ABUNDANT USE OF COLOR, I WANTED THESE TO BE FUN AND ATTRACTIVE FOR CHILDREN. I KNOW THAT CAN BE A DRAWBACK WHEN PRINTING. I'VE PERSONALLY HAD GREAT LUCK PRINTING THESE IN GRAYSCALE.
