MY GOAL HAS ALWAYS BEEN TO MAKE THESE CARDS MATCH THEIR CORRESPONDING BOOK, AS RESULT, THERE IS AN ABUNDANT USE OF COLOR, I WANTED THESE TO BE FUN AND ATTRACTIVE FOR CHILDREN. I KNOW THAT CAN BE A DRAWBACK WHEN PRINTING, I'VE PERSONALLY HAD GREAT LUCK PRINTING THESE IN GRAYSCALE.

Harriet Tubman also served as a scout, spy, guerrilla soldier, and nurse for the Union Army during the Civil War, where her involvement in the Combahee River Raid of 1863 helped liberate more than 700 enslaved people!
